The matching funds must be dedicated to eligible uses as described in subsection 7.''

### SUMMARY

9 This amendment requires a municipality that receives opioid settlement funds to 10 contribute matching funds from its opioid settlement allocation and to provide 11 documentation attesting to those matching funds. The amendment also removes the 12 funding provided in Committee Amendment "A" for a position to administer the Biohazard 13 Waste Disposal Grant Program.

### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The amendment removes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$116,505 in fiscal year 2025-26 and \$121,994 in fiscal year 2026-27 to establish one Comprehensive Health Planner II position to administer a hypodermic apparatus mitigation and collection program.
