An Act to Clarify the Prohibition on Paper Billing Statement Fees

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §9420, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 2011, c. 226, §1, is amended by enacting a new first blocked paragraph to read:

For purposes of this subsection, "billing statement" means a monthly account statement that a person is required to provide to a customer under federal law or regulation. This subsection does not prohibit a person from charging a fee for providing a replacement statement, a statement covering a custom date range or a statement requested for financial or legal purposes or for any other labor-intensive or nonroutine requests to provide copies of statements.

SUMMARY

This bill clarifies that a person is not prohibited from charging a fee for providing a replacement billing statement, a statement covering a custom date range or a statement requested for financial or legal purposes or for any other labor-intensive or nonroutine requests to provide copies of statements.
