An Act Designating July 21st as Maine Commercial Fishing Remembrance Day

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §150-Z is enacted to read:

§150-Z. Maine Commercial Fishing Remembrance Day

July 21st of each year is designated as Maine Commercial Fishing Remembrance Day, and the Governor shall annually issue a proclamation honoring and recognizing those individuals who have lost their lives fishing for lobsters or scallops, digging clams or actively participating in any other commercial fishery in the State.

SUMMARY

This bill designates July 21st of each year as Maine Commercial Fishing Remembrance Day and directs the Governor to annually issue a proclamation honoring and recognizing those individuals who have lost their lives participating in a commercial fishery in the State.
