STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter two hundred and fifty-six of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, relating to the compensation of temporary clerks in the office of the secretary of state.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter two hundred and 2 fifty-six of the public laws of eighteen hundred and 3 sixty-four is hereby amended by striking out all after 4 the word "dollars," in the eighth line of said section, 5 and inserting the following words : "and the compen-6 sation of the clerks so employed shall be fixed by the 7 secretary of state, having regard to the character of 8 the service required of each clerk, and not in any case

9 exceeding three dollars per day for the time such clerk 10 may be actually employed, and travel one way;" so 11 that the last clause of said section, as amended, will 12 read as follows: Temporary clerks may be employed 13 in the office of secretary of state from time to time 14 during each year, as the exigencies of the office may 15 require, the aggregate of whose compensation shall 16 not exceed the sum of five hundred dollars; and the 17 compensation of the clerks so employed shall be fixed 18 by the secretary of state, having regard to the charac-19 ter of the service required of each clerk, and not in 20 any case exceeding three dollars per day for the time 21 such clerk may be actually employed, and travel one 22 way.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
