STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to amend chapter eighty-six of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section ten of chapter eighty-six of the
- 2 revised statutes is amended by adding thereto the fol-
- 3 lowing words:-"And the court before whom any
- 4 trustee is summoned, may appoint a commissioner to
- 5 take the examination and disclosure of such trustee,
- 6 when any other reasonable cause appears, and pre-
- 7 scribe the notice to be given to the plaintiff in the
- 8 suit, of the time and place of such taking; and upon
- 9 return of service made according to such order, the
- 10 examination and disclosure shall be taken and sworn

- 11 to before the commissioner; and being certified by him
- 12 and returned to court, the same proceedings may be
- 13 had thereon as if it had been in court;" so that said
- 14 section as amended shall read as follows:
- 15 Sect. 10. On service made and returned according
- 16 to the order of the justice, the examination and dis-
- 17 closure shall be taken and sworn to before him, and
- 18 being certified and returned to court, the same pro-
- 19 ceedings may be had thereon as if it had been in
- 20 court. And the court, before whom any trustee is
- 21 summoned, may appoint a commissioner to take the
- 22 examination and disclosure of such trustee, when any
- 23 other reasonable cause appears, and prescribe the no-
- 24 tice to be given to the plaintiff in the suit, of the time
- 25 and place of such taking; and upon return of service
- 26 made according to such order, the examination and
- 27 disclosure shall be taken and sworn to before the com-
- 28 missioner; and being certified by him and returned to
- 29 court, the same proceedings may be had thereon as if
- 30 it had been in court.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from the date of 2 its approval.
