STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT authorizing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Any person who has served by enlist-2 ment in the army or navy of the United States, in the 3 war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, on the quota 4 of Maine, and who has been disabled by wounds or 5 other injury received in said service in the line of duty, 6 shall be entitled to a pension from the State of Maine, 7 not exceeding eight dollars per month ; *provided* that 8 such soldier or seaman is unable from his own resources 9 and the United States pension to obtain a livelihood.

SECT. 2. The widow during her widowhood, orphan

2 children under twelve years of age, or the dependent 3 mother or sister of any soldier or seaman deceased 4 from wounds, disease or injury sustained in the service 5 while in the line of duty, are entitled to the same pen-6 sion as is provided in section one, and under similar 7 conditions; *provided* that no more than eight dollars 8 per month be paid to one family.

SECT. 3. Sections one and two of this act shall not 2 be construed so as to include any soldier or seaman 3 who was not a resident of this state at the time of en-4 tering the service, or who has not since become a res-5 ident thereof.

SECT. 4. The execution of this act shall devolve 2 upon the governor or whomsoever he, with the consent 3 and advice of the council, shall appoint, who shall 4 regulate the proof required to entitle applicants to the 5 benefits of this act, and issue certificates therefor.

SECT. 5. Upon the issue of said certificate, the 2 treasurer of the city, town or plantation where the 3 pensioner resides shall be notified thereof, and the said 4 treasurer shall pay quarterly from the treasury of said 5 city, town or plantation, to the pensioner, the amount 6 specified and for the time specified in said certificate, 7 take vouchers therefor, and the same shall be reim-8 bursed to the said treasurer from the treasury of the 9 state on application.

PENSIONS FOR SOLDIERS AND SEAMEN.

SECT. 6. The necessary blanks shall be issued to the 2 mayors of cities, selectmen of towns, and assessors of 3 plantations, as the governor may direct, and the ex-4 penses incurred in printing and distribution shall be 5 paid out of the treasury of the state.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect on the twenty-2 third day of February and continue in force one year.
