STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to provide for a more free navigation of Penobscot river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Owners or occupants of booms or saw
- 2 mills on the Penobscot river and Stillwater branch of
- 3 said river, shall maintain shear booms to prevent logs
- 4 and lumber entering their respective booms or the mill
- 5 ponds of their mills without the consent of owners of
- 6 such logs and lumber; and such owners or occupants
- 7 of such booms and sawmills shall pay the owners of
- 8 the logs and lumber all damages occasioned by neglect
- 9 to maintain such shear booms, unless the logs and
- 10 lumber entering such booms or ponds are delivered out

- 11 of the same within six hours after demand. This act
- 12 does not alter or impair the powers and privileges
- 13 granted boom corporations.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
