STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of codfish, pollock, hake and haddock in the waters of Frenchman's bay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No person shall take or destroy any cod-
- 2 fish, pollock, hake or haddock in the waters of French-
- 3 man's bay within three miles of the shore, except by
- 4 the ordinary process of fishing with baited hooks and
- 5 hand line, so called.
 - SECT. 2. Whoever sets any trawl in the aforesaid
- 2 waters within three miles of the shore, for the purpose
- 3 of taking or destroying any of the aforesaid fish, shall
- 4 forfeit for each offence ten dollars.
 - Sect. 3. All trawls set in the aforesaid waters con-

- 2 trary to the provisions of this act shall be forfeited to
- 3 any person seizing the same, and no action shall be
- 4 maintained in any court of this state against any per-
- 5 son for the recovery of damages for the taking or de-
- 6 struction thereof.
- Sect. 4. The penalties and forfeitures provided for
- 2 in this act may be recovered and appropriated as in
- 3 section fifty-one, chapter forty, of the revised statutes.
 - SECT. 5. The limits of Frenchman's bay seaward
- 2 shall be understood to be, a direct line from the eastern
- 3 end of Schoodic island to the eastern end of Baker's
- 4 island.
- Sect. 6. This act shall take effect on the first day
- 2 of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.
