STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT relieving the town of Chelsea from liability for damages on the roads leading over the lands ceded to the United States for a military asylum.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The town of Chelsea is hereby relieved
2 from all obligation to keep in repair the roads on any
3 portion of the lands called the Togus Springs estate
4 in said town used for a military asylum over which
5 jurisdiction has been ceded to the United States, and
6 the town shall not be liable for any damage occasioned
7 by any defect, obstruction or want of repair in any
8 such road, so long as jurisdiction over said estate shall
9 remain in the United States.

SECT. 2. Absolute jurisdiction and control of the
2 road extending across said Togus Springs estate, from
3 the road leading from Augusta to Windsor, to the
4 road leading from Hallowell to Windsor, is hereby
5 ceded to the United States, so long as the United
6 States shall retain jurisdiction over said Togus Springs
7 estate.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
