STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT in regard to vicious, biting horses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. No person shall allow a vicious, biting
2 horse to stand on any public street, highway or mar-
3 ket place, where there is continual passing and
4 re-passing, without having the mouth of said horse
5 securely muzzled, under a penalty of five dollars for
6 each offence, to be collected of either the owner or
7 keeper of said horse.

SECT. 2. The penalty for violation of section first of
2 this act may be recovered by complaint, and shall
3 belong, one-half to the person complaining, and one-
4 half to the inhabitants of the county in which the
5 complainant resides.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
