STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT giving additional powers to the railroad commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The examination of railroads, now re-2 quired by law to be made by the railroad commis-3 sioners, shall be made at such times as they may deem 4 necessary; and section seven of chapter two hundred 5 thirty-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred 6 sixty-four, which limits the time to which said exam-7 inations shall be made, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. Whenever a serious accident occurs on 2 any railroad in this state, and any person or persons 3 are injured thereby, it shall be the duty of the railroad

4 commissioners to proceed immediately to the place 5 where the accident occurred, and to make an examina-6 tion into the cause of said accident, with authority to 7 send for persons and papers, and make a statement of 8 the cause and result of said accident in their annual 9 report, and also in such other manner as they may 10 deem requisite.
