## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to aid in the construction of the European and North American Railway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The governor of the state is hereby au-

- 2 thorized and empowered to transfer and convey by
- 3 deed to the European and North American Railway
- 4 Company, all the timber and lands belonging to the
- 5 state situated upon the waters of the Penobscot and of
- 6 the St. John rivers, to be used by said company to aid
- 7 in the construction of its line of railway as contem-
- 8 plated and provided for in an act entitled "an act to
- 9 provide means for the defence of the northeastern

10 frontier," approved March twenty-fourth, in the year 11 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred sixty-four, 12 and an act approved February twenty-first, eighteen 13 hundred sixty-six, and subject to all the reservations 14 contained in and the obligations imposed by said acts, 15 except that said company is hereby relieved from the 16 obligation to pay the balance due from this state to 17 Massachusetts as required by said act of eighteen 18 hundred sixty-four; and provided further, that the 19 proceeds of timber and lands hereby granted, or any 20 money which may be raised on a mortgage or sale 21 thereof, as provided by said act of eighteen hundred 22 sixty-six or by the conveyance under this act, shall 23 be applied solely to the construction of a railroad from 24 the town of Lincoln through the town of Winn to the 25 easterly boundary of the state.

Sect. 2. Other railroad companies now incorporated 2 or hereafter to be incorporated in this state shall have 3 the right to connect their railroads with the railroad of 4 the European and North American Railway Company 5 in the city of Bangor or in any other city or town 6 along the line of its road; and no discrimination in the 7 rates of freight or passengers shall be made by said 8 company nor by any party who may operate its line of 9 railway or any part thereof, between railroads having

10 the right to connect with its railroad as aforesaid; but
11 all passengers and all freight coming from or going to
12 any other road having such right to connect shall be
13 transported promptly and on terms alike favorable by
14 said company over its own road, or by any party oper15 ating the same, and on terms as favorable as the like
16 service is or shall be performed for transportation com17 mencing and terminating on the line of railway of said
18 company.

Section one of an act entitled "an act Sect. 3. 2 explanatory of and amending an act additional to and 3 amendatory of an act to provide means for the defence 4 of the northeastern frontier," approved March twenty-5 fifth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-6 dred and sixty-four, is hereby repealed, but the second 7 section of said act is continued in force; and it is 8 hereby provided that this act and the conveyance of 9 timber and lands authorized by it shall in nowise affect 10 the doings of the land agent, and that all moneys 11 received from the sales of land and timber since the 12 twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hun-13 dred and sixty-four, and all notes and other securities 14 in possession of the land agent, as proceeds of sales or 15 parts of sales of land and timber as aforesaid, are 16 declared to be, and are to remain, the property of the

17 state exempt from any legal or equitable claim to the 18 same on the part of said company.

Sect. 4. Before any sale of lands or timber is made, 2 or any mortgage is effected of the lands herein trans-3 ferred and conveyed to the European and North Ameri-4 can Railroad Company, the directors of said road shall 5 appoint two trustees, with the approval of the gov-6 ernor of the state. It shall be the duty of the proper 7 officers of the company to deposit all moneys, or secu-8 rities collected by them, from any sale or mortgage of 9 the property herein transferred and conveyed, in the 10 hands of such trustees, who shall hold the same in 11 trust, until the said railroad is finished to the town of 12 Lincoln; and the trustees aforesaid shall be required 13 to give sufficient bonds, to the approval of the gov-14 ernor, for the faithful execution of their said trust. 15 The moneys and securities so received shall on the 16 completion of said road to the town of Lincoln be paid 17 to said railroad company; provided that the moneys so 18 received in trust may sooner than above limited be 19 used to pay for actual construction of said road be-20 tween said town of Lincoln and the eastern boundary 21 of the state when ordered and approved by the gov-22 ernor.

Sect. 5. No sale, mortgage, transfer or conveyance

- 2 of the timber and lands hereby conveyed to the Euro-
- 3 pean and North American Railroad shall be effected
- 4 unless approved by the governor.
- SECT. 6. This act shall be in force after its ap-2 proval.
