## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT to establish schools in Madawaska territory.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. There shall be established in Mada-
- 2 waska territory, four schools, as follows: One school
- 3 at or near St. Luce; one school at Van Buren; one
- 4 school at Fort Kent; and one school near the line be-
- 5 tween Madawaska and Grant Isle.
  - SECT. 2. There is hereby appropriated for the sup-
- 2 port of said schools, the sum of six hundred dollars, to
- 3 be divided as an agent, to be appointed by the gover-
- 4 nor and conncil, shall deem equitable, who is also em-
- 5 powered to divide the school fund belonging to said
- 6 territory, and to exercise general supervision over the

7 schools therein. Provided however, that before the pro-8 portional part of said six hundred dollars shall be paid 9 to the several schools, the said Van Buren plantation 10 shall raise and appropriate for schools the sum of two 11 hundred dollars, Grant Isle the sum of one hundred 12 and twenty-five dollars, Madawaska the sum of one 13 hundred and fifty dollars, Dion plantation two hundred 14 dollars, and Fort Kent two hundred dollars; and 15 provided further, that the plantations named in this 16 section shall build or furnish good and convenient 17 school houses at the points indicated in section one. 18 And when any of the above designated plantations 19 shall have raised and appropriated its assignment of 20 money, and built or furnished its school house as re-21 quired, then payment shall be made to the school 22 therein located, although other plantations herein 23 named shall have failed to comply with the provisions 24 of this act.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with 2 this act are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
