STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to Soldiers' National Cemetery.

WHEREAS, that by an act entitled "an act to establish and to protect national cemeteries," approved February twenty-second, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, congress has adopted a uniform system for the management and care of all the soldiers' national cemeteries throughout the United States and made provisions for their maintenance; therefore be it

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in Legislature assembled, That we respectfully request of and recommend to the legislature of the State of Pennsylvania the passage of an act empowering the board of commissioners having charge of the Soldiers' National Cemetery at Gettysburg, Pa., to transfer all the right, title, interest and

8 care of said Soldiers' National Cemetery to the general
9 government upon the completion of the same.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to cause a
2 copy of these resolutions to be forwarded to the gov-
3 ernor of Pennsylvania and to the board of commis-
4 sioners having charge of the Soldiers' National Ceme-
5 tery at Gettysburg, in said state.
