## STÁTE OF MAINE.

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT providing a safe depository for wills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. A will may be deposited for safe keep-2 ing, by the testator or any person for him, in the 3 registry of probate in the county where the testator 4 lives; and the register, on being paid the fee of one 5 dollar, shall receive and keep said will, and give a 6 certificate of the deposit thereof.

SECT. 2. Such will shall be inclosed in a sealed 2 wrapper, indorsed with the name and residence of the 3 testator, and the date when deposited, and may have 4 indorsed thereon the name of any person to whom it 5 is to be delivered after the death of the testator.

SECT. 3. A will so deposited shall not be opened.

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2 nor read, until delivered to the testator, or to some
3 person authorized to receive it by an order in writing
4 signed by the testator, and attested by one witness;
5 and the register may require, if he thinks proper, the
6 person presenting such order to make oath that the
7 same is genuine.

SECT. 4. After the death of the testator, the will 2 shall be delivered to the person, if any, entitled by 3 the indorsement on the wrapper to receive it; or, if 4 not demanded before the next probate court following 5 the death of the testator, it may then be publicly 6 opened, and retained in the probate office until offered 7 for probate; or, if the jurisdiction of the estate 8 belongs in another court, it shall be delivered to the 9 executors or other persons entitled to the custody 10 thereof, to be presented for probate in such other court.
