STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and twentyseven of the revised statutes, relating to malicious mischiefs and trespasses on property.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section five of chapter one hundred and
- 2 twenty-seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended
- 3 by inserting after the word "land," in the third line
- 4 thereof, the words "vineyard or any field or en-
- 5 closure," and after the word "another," in the fourth
- 6 line thereof, the words "wherein is cultivated any
- 7 domestic fruit whatever, and which is kept for such
- 8 purpose;" so that said section as amended shall read
- 9 as follows:
- 10 Sect. 5. Whoever wilfully commits any trespass,
- 11 or knowingly authorizes or employs another to do so,

- 12 by entering the garden, orchard, pasture, cranberry
- 13 ground or improved land, vineyard or any field or
- 14 enclosure of another, wherein is cultivated any domes-
- 15 tic fruit whatever, and which is kept for such purpose,
- 16 with intent to take, carry away, destroy or injure the
- 17 trees, shrubs, grain, grass, hay, fruits, vegetables,
- 18 turf or soil thereon, shall be punished by a fine not
- 19 exceeding twenty dollars, and imprisonment not more
- 20 than thirty days.
 - Sect. 2. Section nine of said chapter is hereby
 - 2 amended by inserting after the word "thereto," in
 - 3 the second line thereof, the words "or cuts down,
 - 4 destroys, or in any way injures any tree, shrub or vine
 - 5 within any enclosure or field wherein is cultivated any
 - 6 domestic fruit whatever, or shall injure any building,
- 7 trellis, frame-work, or any appurtenance belonging to
- 8 or upon any such field or enclosure;" so that said
- 9 section as amended shall read as follows:
- 10 Sect. 9. Whoever wilfully and maliciously destroys,
- 11 injures or defaces any building or fixture attached
- 12 thereto, or cuts down, destroys, or in any way injures
- 13 any tree, shrub or vine, within any enclosure or field
- 14 wherein is cultivated any domestic fruit whatever, or
- 15 shall injure any building, trellis, frame-work or any
- 16 appurtenance belonging to or upon any such field or
- 17 enclosure, without consent of the owner; or destroys,

- 18 injures, takes or secretes any goods, chattels or valu-
- 19 able papers of another, shall be punished by imprison-
- 20 ment less than one year, or by fine not exceeding five
- 21 hundred dollars; and also be liable to the party
- 22 injured, in an action of trespass, for three times the
- 23 amount of injury so done.
 - SECT. 3. Said chapter is hereby further amended
 - 2 by adding thereto the following section:
 - 3 Sect. 11. It shall be lawful for the owner of any
 - 4 orchard, fruit-garden, vineyard, or any field or en-
 - 5 closure, wherein is cultivated any fruit whatever, or
 - 6 for any person employed in the cultivation of, or right-
 - 7 fully in the possession of any such field or enclosure,
 - 8 to arrest and convey before any magistrate of the
 - 9 county wherein such arrest is made, any person who
- 10 may be found violating any or either of the provisions
- 11 of sections five and nine of this chapter.
