STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to provide for the organization of parishes of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Any five or more persons, professing
- 2 attachment to the Protestant Episcopal Church, may
- 3 execute and acknowledge before any justice of the
- 4 peace an agreement in writing, whereby they shall
- 5 agree to organize a parish to be maintained in accord-
- 6 ance with the canons, doctrines, discipline and worship
- 7 of the Protestant Episcopal Church
 - SECT. 2. Said agreement shall also contain: First,
- 2 the name or title by which the parish shall be known,
- 3 which shall be as follows, viz., "The Rector, Wardens
- 4 and Vestrymen of ———— church in ————"; but no

- 5 parish shall be organized in any town or city, bearing
- 6 the same name with any other Protestant Episcopal
- 7 Church already organized therein. Second, the town
- 8 or city and county in which it is located. Third, the
- 9 number of vestrymen, not exceeding eleven, and the
- 10 time of the annual meeting, which shall be in Easter
- 11 week.
 - Sect. 3. When said agreement is duly signed and
 - 2 acknowledged, it shall be recorded in the registry of
 - 3 deeds of the county in which the church is located.
 - SECT. 4. Any two or more persons who have signed
 - 2 such agreement, may call the first meeting of such
 - 3 parish, at such time and place as they may see fit, by
 - 4 publishing a notice for five days previously to the time
 - 5 fixed for such meeting, in some newspaper published
 - 6 in the town or city in which such church is located,
 - 7 and if no newspaper is published therein, then such
 - 8 notice may be given by posting the same in two pub-
 - 9 lic places in such city or town, and at such meeting
- 10 the affidavit of such publishing or posting shall be re-
- 11 corded in the minutes; at such meeting, in addition
- 12 to the signers of such agreement, any male person of
- 13 full age shall be entitled to vote, who shall sign a
- 14 declaration, in writing, to be kept in the book of
- 15 minutes, whereby he shall signify his intention of
- 16 attaching himself to said church and accepting the

- 17 terms of said agreement. At such meeting two war-
- 18 dens and the required number of vestrymen may be
- 19 elected, or at any adjournment thereof.
 - Sect. 5. At all subsequent meetings, the right of
 - 2 voting shall be confined to the persons who became
 - 3 actually entitled to vote at the first meeting, and to
 - 4 such other male persons of full age as have, during the
 - 5 previous six months, been stated worshippers in said
 - 6 church and stated contributors to its support, and have
 - 7 signed the written declaration referred to in section
 - 8 four.
 - Sect. 6. The wardens and vestrymen so elected,
 - 2 (two-thirds of them concurring in the choice,) may
 - 3 choose some fit person, duly qualified, to act as min-
 - 4 ister or rector of said church, agreeably to the consti-
 - 5 tution of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the
 - 6 United States of America; their choice shall be sub-
 - 7 mitted to the parish for approval, and if approved by
 - 8 a majority of those present, at any duly called parish
 - 9 meeting, the person so elected shall be the rector or
- 10 minister of the parish. The minister or rector so
- 11 chosen shall preside at all meetings of the wardens
- 12 and vestrymen and have a casting vote, unless the
- 13 business or question to be decided has relation to the
- 14 personal interest of said minister or rector; provided,
- 15 that in the absence of such rector or minister, one of

- 16 the wardens shall preside. Whenever a vacancy
- 17 shall occur in the office of minister or rector by death,
- 18 removal or otherwise, the wardens and vestrymen may
- 19 elect a successor in the mode hereinbefore provided.
 - SECT. 7. The annual meeting shall take place at
 - 2 such time in Easter week as may have been agreed
 - 3 upon, and at such annual meeting an election of the
 - 4 requisite number of wardens and vestrymen shall be
 - 5 had, to serve until the next annual meeting, and until
 - 6 their successors shall be chosen.
 - SECT. 8. The rector, wardens, and vestrymen ap-
 - 2 pointed as aforesaid, shall be a body corporate and
 - 3 politic, with all the rights and liabilities pertaining
 - 4 thereto, except as herein provided; provided neverthe-
 - 5 less, if at any time the parish be without a minister or
 - 6 rector, the same rights and privileges shall be vested
 - 7 in the wardens and vestrymen.
 - Sect. 9. The rector, wardens and vestrymen, or a
 - 2 majority of them, may make rules, by-laws and ordi-
 - 3 nances, and do anything needful and requisite for the
 - 4 good government and support of the parish, provided
 - 5 that said rules, by-laws and ordinances shall not be
 - 6 repugnant to the constitution and by-laws of this state
 - 7 or of the United States; all vacancies in such vestry
 - 8 may be filled by the vestrymen at any meeting, and
 - 9 the persons elected to fill such vacancies shall hold for

10 the same period as their predecessors would have 11 done.

Sect. 10. All the temporal affairs of such parishes

- 2 shall be managed by the rector, wardens and vestry-
- 3 men thereof, and they shall have authority to alter,
- 4 erect, repair, enlarge, and in case they deem it neces-
- 5 sary, to take down or remove and rebuild any church
- 6 or other building belonging to such corporation.
 - Sect. 11. It shall be lawful to such corporations to
- 2 hold real estate to such an amount as shall be reason-
- 3 ably necessary for a church, lectures or school rooms,
- 4 for dwellings for the ministers thereof, for hospitals or
- 5 charitable purposes, but it shall not be lawful for such
- 6 corporations to hold or use any real estate for any
- 7 other purpose.
 - SECT. 12. Any parish of the Protestant Episcopal
- 2 Church, heretofore organized under any other general
- 3 law may reorganize, so as to become subject to the
- 4 provisions of this act, whenever such parish shall at
- 5 any duly called parish meeting authorize the wardens
- 6 and vestrymen to execute and acknowledge an agree-
- 7 ment as provided in this act, which agreement shall
- 8 in addition to the requisites mentioned in the first
- 9 section, set forth that it is executed for the purpose of
- 10 reorganizing such parish according to the provisions
- 11 of this act. Such agreement shall be deemed sufficient

- 12 when so executed and acknowledged by a majority of
- 13 such wardens and vestrymen and recorded in said
- 14 registry of deeds.

SECT. 13. Upon such execution, acknowledgment

- 2 and recording of such agreement, such parish shall,
- 3 without further action, be deemed to all intents and
- 4 purposes reorganized, and all rights of property and
- 4 of contract shall remain unimpaired and the corporate
- 5 identity of such parish shall continue unchanged.
- 6 The wardens and vestrymen in office shall continue
- 7 therein until the annual election in Easter week next
- 8 following such reorganization, and until a new board
- 9 shall be chosen, and no other meeting or notice shall
- 10 be necessary to complete such reorganization; provided,
- 11 that when a new board shall be chosen, it shall con-
- 12 sist of the number of vestrymen required by such arti-
- 13 cles of reorganization.
 - SECT. 14. All persons, members of such parish be-
 - 2 fore its reorganization, shall be deemed members of
 - 3 the same after its reorganization, and entitled to vote
 - 4 at the annual and other meetings.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
