STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, relating to the settlement of paupers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The first section of chapter two hundred
- 2 and nineteen of the public laws of eighteen hundred
- 3 and sixty-eight, entitled "an act to repeal the twenty-
- 4 second section of chapter twenty-four of the revised
- 5 statutes," is hereby amended by adding to said section
- 6 the following words: "And the state in like manner
- 7 shall reimburse towns that may furnish relief to paupers
- 8 that have no legal settlement in any town in this state
- 9 and have removed from an unincorporated place," so
- 10 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

- 11 Section twenty-two of chapter twenty-four of the
- 12 revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following
- 13 section is hereby substituted:
- 14 Persons living in places not incorporated and need-
- 15 ing relief are under the care of the overseers of the
- 16 oldest incorporated adjoining town, or the nearest in-
- 17 corporated town when there are none adjoining, who
- 18 shall furnish relief to such persons in the same manner
- 19 as though they were found in such town. And such
- 20 overseers may bind to service the children of such per-
- 21 sons as they may those of paupers of their own town,
- 22 and may bind out persons described in section twenty
- 23 in the manner therein provided residing in such unin-
- 24 corporated place as if in their own town, such person
- 25 being entitled to a like remedy and relief. When
- 26 relief is provided for paupers residing in such places,
- 27 the towns furnishing it are entitled to the same reme-
- 28 dies against the towns where they have a settlement
- 29 as if such persons resided in the town where the relief
- 30 is afforded. And if such paupers have no legal settle-
- 31 ment in any town in this state, then the state shall
- 32 reimburse to the town affording relief the amount paid
- 33 out and expended, or such portion thereof as the gov-.
- 34 ernor and may adjudge to have been judiciously ex-
- 35 pended. And the state in like manner shall reimburse
- 36 towns that may furnish relief to paupers that have no

- 37 legal settlement in any town in this state and have
- 38 removed from an unincorporated place.
 - SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
