## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to render valid certain doings of towns in voting commutations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The past acts and doings, regular in 2 form, of cities, towns and plantations, in offering, pay-3 ing, agreeing to pay, and in raising and providing the 4 means to pay commutations to drafted men, and all 5 notes and town orders given by the municipal officers 6 of any city, town or plantation, in pursuance of a pre-7 vious vote, at a meeting regularly called and held for 8 the benefit of drafted men, are hereby made valid.

SECT. 2. All contracts heretofore made by the 2 municipal officers of any city, town or plantation, that 3 has voted, at meetings duly called and held, to raise

4 money to pay commutations thus voted, and all con-5 tracts heretofore made by said officers, or their duly 6 authorized agents, with third persons, corporations or 7 associations, for the purpose of raising means to pay 8 such commutations so voted, are hereby made valid.

SECT. 3. All contracts heretofore made by such
2 municipal officers, or by third persons, in behalf of any
3 city, town or plantation, but without previous authority
4 therefor, to pay commutations to such drafted men or
5 to raise money to pay such commutations, may be
6 ratified or confirmed by said city, town or plantation.
SECT. 4. The doings of any city, town or planta-

2 tion, in voting to pay or in raising money to pay com-3 mutations, may be ratified and confirmed by said city,4 town or plantation.

SECT. 5. All taxes that have been assessed to raise 2 funds to pay commutations, or to fulfil contracts for 3 the objects named in this act, are hereby made valid.

SECT. 6. Nothing in this act shall affect in any way 2 the equalization of municipal war debts.
