STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to explain chapter ninety-one of the laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine and chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, each entitled “an act to encourage manufactures.”

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Nothing in chapter ninety-one of the
2 public laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine nor in
3 chapter two hundred and thirty-four of the public
4 laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, each entitled
5 “an act to encourage manufactures” shall be con-
6 strued as exempting from taxation, after assent thereto
7 by any town or city, anything other than the erec-
8 tions used for manufacturing purposes only ; the water

9 or other power for propelling such manufactory, the
10 capital and machinery for operating the same as speci-
11 fied in said acts, exclusive of the land and other
12 property connected with such erections.

SECT. 2. The time of "ten years" named in chap-
2 ter ninety-one of the public laws of eighteen hundred
3 and fifty-nine shall be construed as commencing from
4 the date of the assent to such exemption given by
5 any town or city in the manner provided in said act.

SECT. 3. All property exempted from taxation in
2 accordance with chapter ninety-one of the public
3 laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-nine shall be en-
4 tered on the assessment books of towns and cities, and
5 returned with the valuation of such towns and cities
6 when required by the state for the purposes of state
7 valuation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
