STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to authorize the erection and maintenance of a sluice at Upper Stillwater.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Ebenezer Webster, Charles Buffum, 2 James S. Hamilton, Paul D. Webster, Samuel White, 3 Robert J. Hamilton, William M. Rollins, William 4 Marden, Jones S. Kelley, Andrew G. Ring, James 5 Webster, Nathaniel Chapman, Joab W. Palmer, Ben-6 jamin Johnson, Daniel Lunt, George W. Pickering, 7 their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby 8 constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name 9 of "The Orono Sluice Company," with power to 10 erect and maintain a sluice and sluiceway at Upper 11 Stillwater, so called, in the town of Oldtown, at such

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12 location, of such width and depth, and upon such con-13 ditions as the county commissioners of Penobscot14 county shall direct.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may demand and receive 2 a toll of two cents per thousand feet board measure, 3 Bangor survey, on all logs and lumber passing through 4 the same, and shall have a lien on all such logs and 5 lumber for payment of the tolls. The toll shall be 6 payable at such time and place as the directors may 7 determine, and if not so paid, said corporation may 8 take and sell at public auction, after ten days' public 9 notice, so many of the logs as is necessary to pay said 10 tolls.

SECT. 3. Said corporation may take and hold real 2 and personal estate to the amount of not exceeding 3 five thousand dollars, with full power to manage and 4 dispose of the same, and the rents and profits, as well 5 as the tolls, as the interests of the corporation may 6 require.

SECT. 4. The county commissioners of Penobscot 2 county, when requested by said corporation, are here-3 by authorized and required, at the expense of said 4 corporation, to locate said sluice and sluiceway, to 5 prescribe the depth and width thereof, and to decide 6 such other matters concerning the construction thereof 7 as may be properly submitted to them. They shall

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8 give five days' public notice of their intention to locate9 the same.

SECT. 5. Ebenezer Webster or Charles Buffum may 2 call the first meeting of the corporation by publishing 3 a notice of the time, place and purpose of the same, 4 in the Bangor Daily Whig and Courier, seven days 5 before the meeting.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved 2 by the governor.
