STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINE.

AN ACT to amend section eighteen of chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, relating to the authority of municipal officers to lay out, alter or widen town and private ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section eighteen of chapter eighteen of 2 the revised statutes is hereby amended, by adding 3 thereto, in the fourth line of said section, between the 4 word "therein" and the word "on," the following 5 words, "or in an adjoining town," so that said section 6 as amended shall read as follows:—The municipal 7 officers of towns may personally or by agency lay out, 8 alter or widen town ways and private ways for one or 9 more of its inhabitants, or for owners of cultivated

10 land therein, or in an adjoining town, on petition
11 therefor. They shall give written notice of their in-
12 tentions, to be posted for seven days in two public
13 places in the town and in the vicinity of the way,
14 describing it in them.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
