STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relating to biennial sessions of the legislature and to biennial elections of governor, councillors, secretary of state, treasurer, senators and representatives, and attorney general, judges and registers of probate, adjutant and quartermaster generals, sheriffs, land agent; and to fix the compensation of senators and representatives.

Resolved, two-thirds of both branches of the legisla
2 ture concurring, That the constitution of this state

3 shall be amended as follows:—In article second, fourth

4 section, second line, by striking out the word "annu
5 ally" and inserting the word "biennially." In

6 article fourth, part first, fifth section, thirty-third line,

7 by striking out the word "annually" and inserting

8 the word "biennially." In article fourth, part sec
9 ond, third section, tenth line, by inserting the word

10 "biennially" after the word "January;" and in

11 same article, fourth section, third line, by inserting 12 the word "biennially" after the word "January;" 13 and in same article, fifth section, second line, by 14 striking out the word "annually" and inserting the 15 word "biennially." In article fifth, part first, second 16 section, second line, by striking out the words "one 17 year" and inserting the words "two years;" and in 18 third line of same article and section, by striking out 19 the words "in each year" and inserting the words 20 "in the year his election is declared." In article 21 fifth, part second, second section, first line, by strik-22 ing out the word "annually" and inserting the word 23 "biennially." In article fifth, part third, first sec-24 tion, first line, by striking out the word "annually" 25 and inserting the word "biennially." In article fifth, 26 part fourth, first section, first line, by striking out the 27 word "annually" and inserting the word "bienni-28 ally." Article sixth as amended, section seven, third 29 line, by striking out the word "annual" and inserting 30 the word "biennial." In same article and section, 31 eleventh line, by striking out the word "thereafter" 32 and inserting the words "after another election has 33 been held." In seventh article, third section as 34 amended, fourth line, by striking out the word "annu-35 ally" and inserting the word "biennially." 36 cle ninth, fourth section, second line, by striking out

37 the word "annually" and inserting the word "bien-38 nially." In article ninth as amended, ninth section, 39 third line, by inserting after the word "September" 40 the word "biennially." In ninth article as amended, 41 tenth section, second line, by striking out the word 42 "annually" and inserting the word "biennially." 43 The fourth article, part third, shall be amended by 44 inserting at the end thereof the following section: Sect. 13. Each member of the senate and house of 46 representatives shall be paid at the close of the session 47 of the legislature next after his election two hundred 48 dollars, and three dollars for every ten miles of travel 49 from his place of abode at each session; and at extra 50 sessions called by the governor under this constitution, 51 three dollars per day for each day such session shall And the compensation provided in this 52 continue. 53 section shall not be increased. In all cases of biennial 54 elections provided for in this resolve, the first elections 55 shall take place on the days and times herein pre-56 scribed occurring next after the amendment providing 57 for such elections shall have been declared by the legis-58 lature to be adopted as a part of the constitution.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities and the select-2 men of the several towns and the assessors of the 3 several plantations in the state, are hereby empowered 4 and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective

5 cities, towns and plantations in the manner prescribed 6 by law at the annual meeting in September next, to 7 give in their votes upon the amendments proposed in 8 the foregoing resolve; and the question shall be, shall 9 the constitution be amended as proposed by a resolve 10 of the legislature providing that the legislature shall 11 convene, the governor, councillors, secretary of state, 12 treasurer, senators and representatives, judges and 13 registers of probate, adjutant general and quarter-14 master general, sheriffs, land agent and attorney gen-15 eral shall be chosen, as provided by the constitution, 16 biennially, and fix the pay of senators and representa-And the inhabitants of said cities, towns and 18 plantations shall vote by ballot on said questions of 19 electing said officers biennially and to fix the pay of 20 senators and representatives, as provided in the fore-21 going resolve; those in favor of said amendments 22 respectively expressing it by the word "YES" upon 23 their ballots, and those opposed to the amendments 24 respectively expressing it by the word "no" upon 25 their ballots; and the ballots shall be received, sorted, 26 counted and declared, in open ward, town and planta-27 tion meetings, and lists shall be made out of the votes 28 by the aldermen, selectmen and assessors and clerks of 29 the several cities, towns and plantations, and returned 30 to the office of the secretary of state, in the same man-

- 31 ner as votes for senators; and the governor and coun-
- 32 cil shall count the same and make return thereof to
- 33 the next legislature, and if a majority of the votes are
- 34 in favor of any of said amendments, the constitution
- 35 shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare

- 2 and furnish the several cities, towns and plantations,
- 3 blank returns, in conformity to the foregoing resolves,
- 4 accompanied with a copy thereof.
