STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to continue in force the provisions of chapter one hundred and seventy of laws of one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, authorizing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter one hundred
2 and seventy, public laws of one thousand eight hun-
3 dred and sixty-eight, are hereby continued in force,
4 from and after the twenty-third day of February, one
5 thousand eight hundred and seventy, to and including
6 the thirty-first day of December of the same year;
7 and the fractional quarterly payment for the term
8 between the twenty-third day of November and the
9 thirty-first day of December of the year one thousand

10 eight hundred and seventy shall be computed and paid
11 as of the day of the last date.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
