STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT additional to chapter eleven of the laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

If any person between the first day of January and
2 the first day of September, take, kill, or destroy any
3 grouse, or partridges, or shall within the time afore-
4 said sell, buy or have in his possession any of the
5 aforesaid birds taken or killed as aforesaid, he shall
6 forfeit for every such bird the sum of one dollar, to be
7 recovered by complaint before any justice of the peace,
8 for the use of complainant.
