IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to amend section nine of chapter thirty of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section nine of chapter thirty of the revised statutes 2 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

- 3 Sect. 9. No person shall hunt or kill on any land
- 4 in this state any moose, deer or caribou from the first
- 5 day of January to the first day of October, under a
- 6 penalty of forty dollars for each moose, deer or caribou
- 7 so killed; any person may lawfully shoot or otherwise
- 8 kill any dog found hunting moose, deer or caribou
- 9 within the time or with the persons herein prohibited.
