STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1867 the petitioner (Moses Perry) contracted with the Land Agent to build a piece of road in Crystal Plantation, for \$300 in money, and 30,000 feet of spruce stumpage. The road was finished and accepted late in the year 1867, and the money was paid, but the stumpage he never got, for the reason, that the lot which was contiguous to the road, and on which the timber was standing, as it proved, did not belong to the State, (contrary to the opinion of both parties when the contract was made) and of course, was not at the disposal of the Agent.

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Moses Perry.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby 2 authorized and directed to pay Moses Perry, the sum 3 of sixty dollars, and interest from the first day of 4 January, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, it being

5 for balance due him for building state road in Crystal

6 plantation in eighteen hundred and sixty-seven.
