STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In the summer of 1862 a State road was located, beginning at the road leading to Houlton, and running easterly to the east line of Island Falls, a distance of about five miles. There has been a good deal of labor expended on this road by the settlers; and it passes over several State lots, but is rendered useless for want of a bridge over Beaver Dam Brook, an insignificant stream but for the dam at the foot of the lake, built by the Log Driving Company, under authority of the State, since the location of said road. The settlers think that they could have got along without help but for this flowage, which has made that brook so formidable, that they, being poor, are unable to build a bridge over it without some little aid.

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of building a bridge over Beaver Dam brook in Island Falls plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be and 2 the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under 3 the direction of the land agent, to aid in building a 4 bridge over Beaver Dam brook, in the plantation of 5 Island Falls, to be paid when said bridge is completed.
