STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter twenty-five of the public laws of one thousand eight hundred and sixtynine, relative to the sale of milk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one, chapter twenty-five of the public laws of 2 eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, are hereby amended, 3 by striking out the word "may" after the word "towns" 4 in the second line of said section, and inserting the 5 word "shall," so that said section when amended shall 6 read as follows:

7 SECT. 1. The mayor and aldermen of cities and 8 selectmen of towns shall annually appoint one or more 9 persons to be inspectors of milk, *provided* such city or 10 town contains not less than three thousand inhabitants,

11 who shall, before entering upon the discharge of the
12 duties of their office, be sworn. Each inspector shall
13 give notice of his appointment by publishing the same
14 two weeks in a newspaper published in his city or town,
15 or if no newspaper is published therein by posting up
16 such notice in two or more public places in said town.
