STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to amend chapter forty of the revised statutes, relating to herring boxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter forty of the revised statutes is amended by 2 striking out the ninth section thereof and inserting 3 the following instead:

4 SECT. 9. All boxes for packing smoked herring 5 shall be made of sound boards, sawed and seasoned; 6 the top, bottom and sides, of boards not less than three-7 eighths of an inch thick, and the ends, of boards three-8 fourths of an inch thick, securely nailed, and sixteen 9 inches in length, eight inches in breadth, and five 10 inches in depth, by outside measurement; provided, 11 that any change in the dimensions above named shall

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12 not operate to reduce their capacity, which shall not 13 be less than four hundred and sixty-four cubic inches 14 in the clear, for each box; and each box shall be 15 filled with the same kind and quality of fish; and if 16 the box contain "Magdalen" herring, that word shall 17 be abridged if considered convenient, and no such fish 18 shall be considered merchantable unless salted and 19 smoked sufficiently to cure and preserve them, which 20 shall then be closely packed, in boxes, in clear dry 21 weather.
