STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Committee on State Lands and State Roads would submit the following Statement of Facts: That the town of Madrid being in debt, and the inhabitants poor—and in consequence of the freshet of Oct. 4th, 1869, the bridges in that town were almost all carried away and the roads greatly damaged—particularly the road leading from Phillips to Rangely through the town of Madrid; and that it being a public thoroughfare, the public good require that the sum named in the Resolve should be appropriated by the State and expended as therein specified.

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Madrid, in aid of repairing road in said town.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be, 2 and the same is hereby appropriated, in aid of repairing 3 road leading from Phillips to Rangely, through the 4 town of Madrid, in the county of Franklin, the same 5 to be expended under the direction of the county com-6 missioners of said county; provided, that the town of 7 Madrid shall expend a like sum on said road, on or 8 before the first day of July, one thousand eight hun-9 dred and seventy-one.
