STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in relation to the services of George F.
Robinson.

Resolved, That the heroic conduct of George F. Robinson, late a soldier of company K, eighth regiment Maine volunteers, in protecting the life of the Hon. William H. Seward, late secretary of state of the United States, from the knife of an assassin, on the evening of fourteenth of April, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, at the imminent peril of his own, and at the expense of permanent wounds, merits, and should receive public recognition by the legislature of this state, and by the congress of the United States, to the end that his noble deeds may be known and remembered by the American people.

Resolved, That the national honor demands that inquiry be made relative to the personal wants and

3 means of support of the said George F. Robinson, to
4 the end that provision may be made for his future
5 welfare by the government of the United States, such
6 as right and justice demand, and the generous impulses
7 of a grateful people require.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolves be forwarded
2 by the secretary of state to each of our senators and
3 representatives in congress.
