STATEMENT OF FACTS

Relating to petition of William W. Quimby for continuance of State Pension.

The Committee on Pensions, in obedience to instructions of the Legislature, submit the following brief statement:

That William W. Quimby, the petitioner, a resident of Bucksport in this State, at a military parade in the town of Athens in this State, thirty-five years ago, or thereabouts, was maimed, and lost the thumb of his left hand; that he is now sixty-five years old, has a family consisting of himself, his wife and two sons; the eldest of these sons is eighteen, and the other about sixteen years of age. He has a farm and stock valued by the assessors at \$967. His wife receives a pension from the United States of eight dollars per month on account of the loss of a son in the late war. The petitioner has received from the State because of his disability, pensions under sundry resolves, extending from January, 1842, to January, 1870, the sum of \$1,176; but he represents himself as being now old and poor and wholly unable to labor.

- 3 dollars per month, from the first day of January, in
- 4 the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
- 5 seventy, and continued during his life, for injuries
- 6 received while in the service of the state.
