STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Passamaquoddy
tribe of Indians for eighteen hundred seventy.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury,
2 to be expended under the direction of the governor
3 and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe
4 of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe, as follows, viz :
5 balance due agent as per account rendered for eighteen
6 hundred sixty-nine, one hundred forty-four dollars and
7 seventy-six cents ; four hundred dollars for May divi-
8 dend ; three hundred dollars for November dividend ;
9 seven hundred dollars for distressed poor ; the foregoing
10 to be paid from the interest on the trust fund belonging
11 to said tribe ; also five hundred dollars for agricultural
12 purposes ; three hundred dollars for bounties on crops
13 for the year eighteen hundred seventy ; one hundred
14 fifty dollars for plowing ; forty dollars for salary of

15 governor of said tribe, and twenty dollars for salary of
16 its lieutenant governor; fifty dollars for wood to be
17 distributed to families that remain through the winter
18 at Pleasant point; one hundred twenty-five dollars for
19 repairing priest's house at Pete Dana's point; one
20 hundred fifty dollars for repairing hall at Pleasant
21 point; one hundred sixty dollars for repairing chapel
22 at Pleasant point; fifty dollars for payment of priest,
23 provided that he administer ten masses or more to
24 each section of tribe; three hundred dollars for edu-
25 cational purposes, to be expended by the superin-
26 tending school committees of Perry and Princeton, and
27 said committees are requested to report as directed by
28 resolve approved February twenty-second, eighteen
29 hundred sixty-five; and three hundred dollars for
30 salary of agent of said tribe; *provided however*, that
31 the agent shall not furnish or cause to be furnished
32 any merchandise prior to the time provided for in these
33 resolves, for the distribution of the several amounts
34 specified; if cash or merchandise advances are made,
35 said charges shall not be deducted from the dividends,
36 only upon the consent of the Indian who has received
37 such advances.
