STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable Legislature of the State of Maine:

The petitioner, resident of Benton, county of Kennebec, respectfully represents that he is now 82 years of age, of poor health and destitute of means for his support. That in 1812 he enlisted in the 45th Regiment, Col. McCobb, and served in the war two years. That at the time of his said enlistment the country was in great need of men, and men were hard to obtain; that he cheerfully enlisted to preserve his country from English oppression, and served his term faithfully, performing every duty imposed upon him. He now asks the Legislature of his own State to make him some allowance so that he may not suffer while prosperity blesses the country which he fought to save.

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Beriah Brown.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the
2 state, to Beriah Brown of the town of Benton in this
3 state, the sum of four dollars per month, commencing
4 with the first day of January, in the year of our Lord
5 one thousand eight hundred and seventy. Payments
6 to be made quarterly, and continued during the pleas-
7 ure of the legislature.
