STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the removal of obstructions from Penobscot river.

WHEREAS, The city of Bangor has attained a promi-2 nent position among the commercial cities of the union, 3 now ranking the tenth among the Atlantic ports; and

WHEREAS, Obstructions exist in the bed and channel 2 of Penobscot river, between Hampden and the city of 3 Bangor, consisting of rocks and sundry deposits, which 4 seriously injure the navigation and commerce of that 5 important river; and

WHEREAS, The extensive national commerce con-2 nected with Bangor, which is constantly increasing 3 with the growth of central and eastern Maine, re-4 quires the removal of these obstructions, and the 5 deepening and improvement of the channel; and

WHEREAS, The national government have, through 2 surveys made by their engineers, taken steps looking

3 to the improvement of the navigation of this river, 4 therefore

Resolved, That the state of Maine deem it the duty 2 of congress to make, without delay, such appropria-3 tion as may be required to improve the navigation of 4 said river, by the removal of such obstructions there-5 from; and that our senators and representatives in 6 congress be requested to use their best efforts to 7 accomplish that result.

Resolved, That the secretary of state is hereby re-2 quested to forward an attested copy of these resolves 3 to each of our representatives in congress.
