STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Plantation No. 5, R. 3, in the southern part of Aroostook county, was lotted for settlement in 1858. The greater part of the lots are taken up by settlers. The road this resolve favors is one of the through routes recommended by the Land Agent in his last Report. It is a very important road, leading nearly direct from Patten to Houlton, the greater part of the distance through State lands. By making the appropriation recommended the road can be completed and opened for travel the ensuing summer. The inhabitants are unable to aid in opening this road, as they have other new roads to build for the accommodation of the settlers. The State has annually received considerable sums for stumpage of lumber cut on this plantation. It received in 1869 about \$3,000, and will receive nearly as much the present season.

The Committee voted unanimously to recommend the appropriation.

6 agent.
