## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to amend section seventeen of chapter sixty-five of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section seventeen of chapter sixty-five
- 2 of the revised statutes is amended, by adding after the
- 3 word "one" in the tenth line of said section, the
- 4 following: "Where no distribution of the estate has
- 5 been made, and the parties in interest reside out of the
- 6 state, and no actual notice has been given of such
- 7 settlement, the judge of the court wherein such settle-
- 8 ment was made, may, on petition of any such party,
- 9 order a new account of his doings to be presented to
- 10 said court by the executor or administrator, at any

- 11 time within six years after such settlement is made;"
- 12 so that the section as amended shall read as follows:
- 13 Sect. 17. When on the settlement of any account of
- 14 an administrator or executor there appears to remain
- 15 in his hands any property not necessary for the pay-
- 16 ment of debts and expenses of administration, not
- 17 specifically bequeathed, the judge shall order the same
- 18 to be distributed according to the will of the deceased,
- 19 if any, so far as it directs, otherwise according to the
- 20 provisions of chapter seventy-five, but no such order
- 21 determining who are heirs and the share of each, shall
- 22 be passed until notice is given as provided in section
- 23 five chapter seventy-one; and where no distribution of
- 24 the estate has been made, and the parties in interest
- 25 reside out of the state, and no actual notice of such
- 26 settlement has been given them of such settlement, the
- 27 judge of the court wherein such settlement was made
- 28 may on the petition of any such party order a new ac-
- 29 count of his doings to be presented to said court at any
- 30 time within six years after such settlement, and alien-
- 31 age shall be no bar to any person who in other respects
- 32 is entitled to receive the same.
