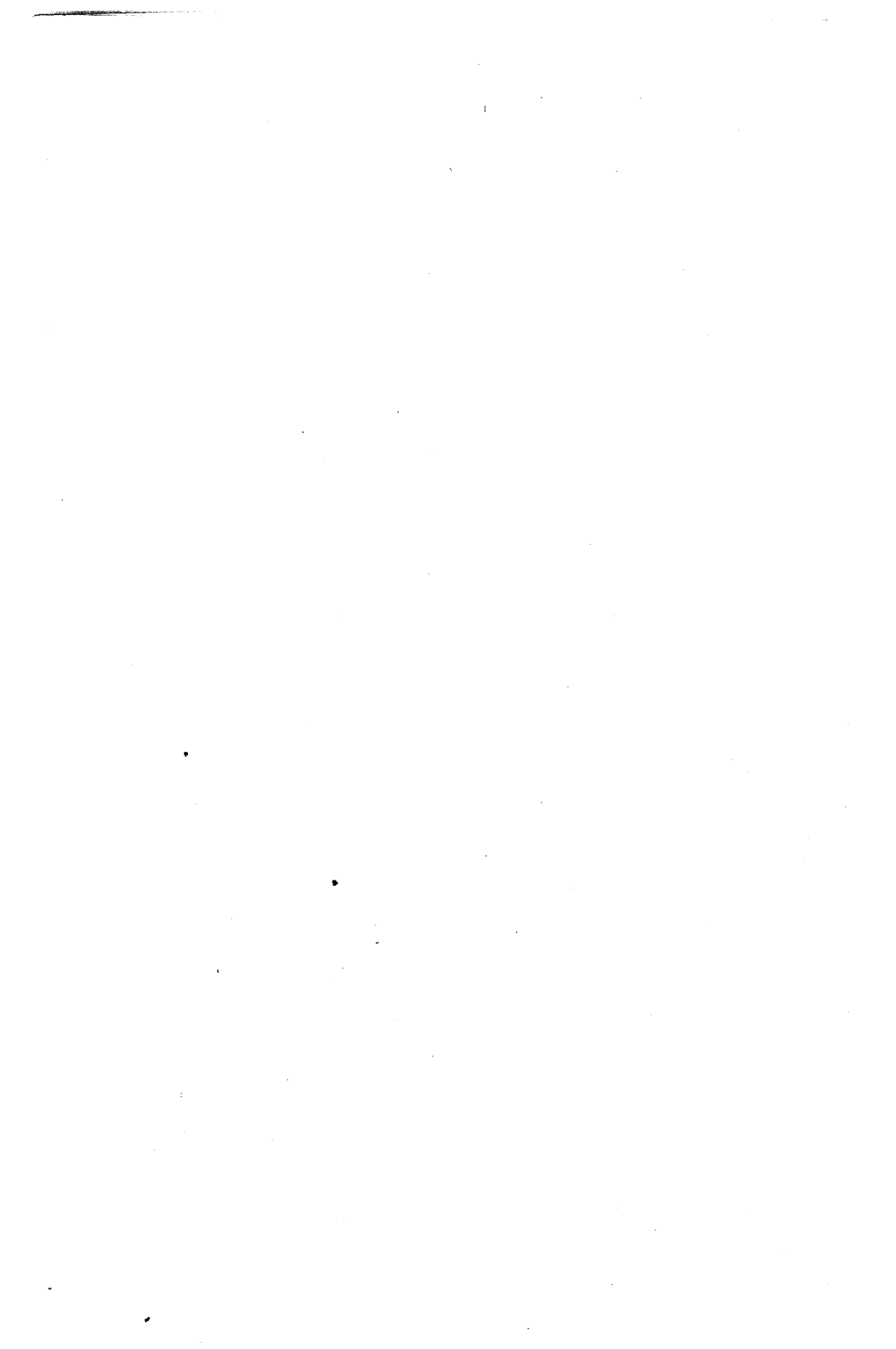
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to amend chapter twenty-four of the revised statutes, relating to paupers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The first specification of the first section of chapter
2 twenty-four of the revised statutes is amended so as to
3 read as follows :

4 A married woman has the settlement of her husband
5 if he has any in the state, if he has not, her own
6 settlement is not affected by her marriage. When it
7 appears in a suit between towns involving the settle-
8 ment of a pauper, that a marriage was procured to
9 change it by the agency or collusion of the officers of
10 either town, or any person having charge of such pau-
11 per under authority of either town, the settlement is
12 not effected by such marriage.
