STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT additional to chapter one hundred and twentysix of the revised statutes, concerning frauds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whoever fraudulently makes or utters any receipt or

- 2 other written evidence of the delivery or deposit of
- 3 any grain, flour, pork, wool or other goods, wares or
- 4 merchandise in any warehouse, mill, store or other
- 5 building, when the quantity specified therein had not,
- 6 in fact, been so delivered and deposited in such build-
- 7 ing; or so makes or utters any receipt or other written
- 8 evidence of the delivery or deposit with him of any
- 9 bonds or other securities or evidence of debt, when
- 10 the same have not, in fact, been so delivered and de-
- 11 posited, shall be punished by imprisonment not less
- 12 than one year nor more than ten.
