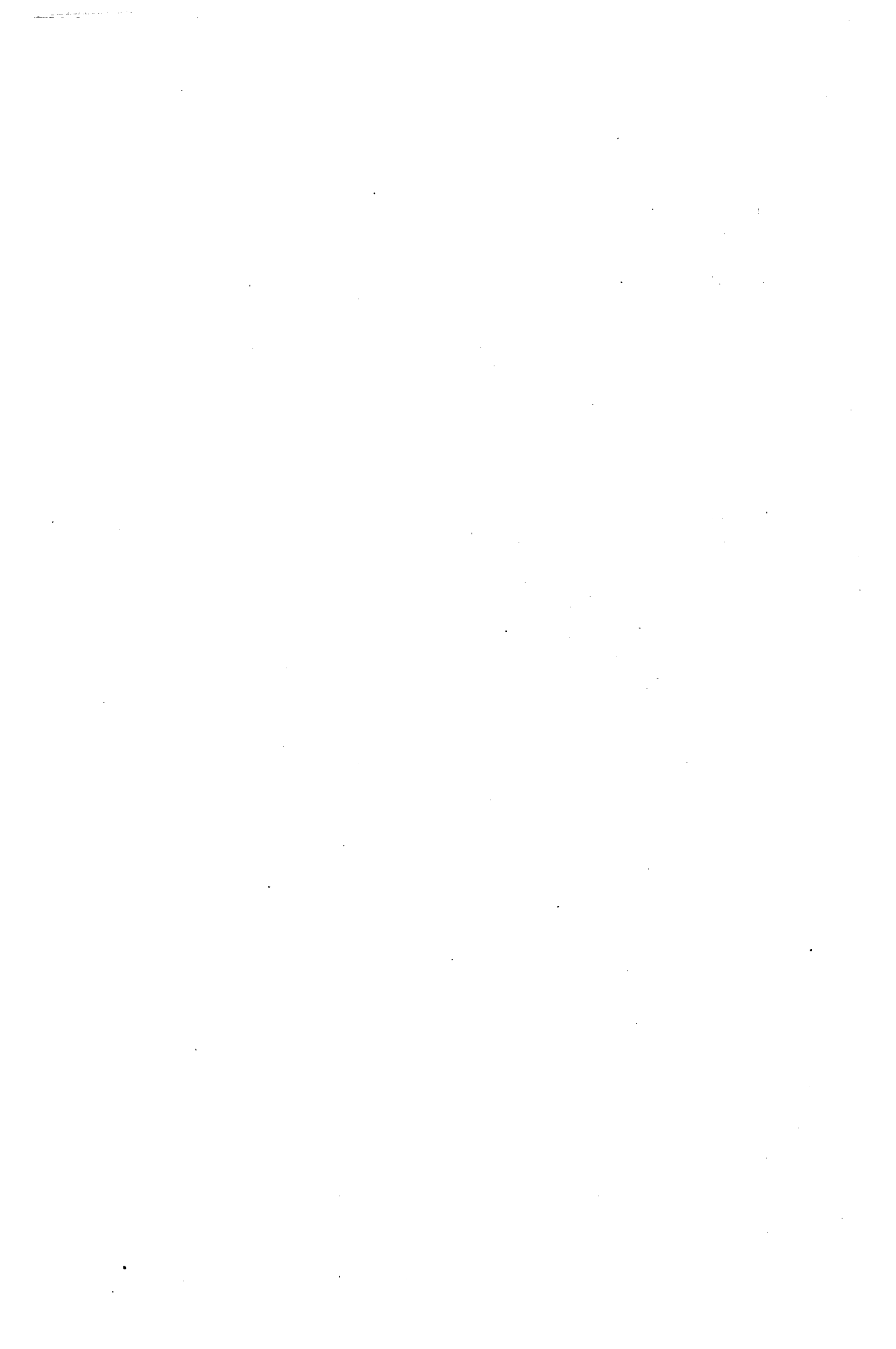
STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT additional to chapter one hundred and twenty-six of the revised statutes, concerning frauds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Whoever fraudulently makes or utters any receipt or
2 other written evidence of the delivery or deposit of
3 any grain, flour, pork, wool or other goods, wares or
4 merchandise in any warehouse, mill, store or other
5 building, when the quantity specified therein had not,
6 in fact, been so delivered and deposited in such build-
7 ing ; or so makes or utters any receipt or other written
8 evidence of the delivery or deposit with him of any
9 bonds or other securities or evidence of debt, when
10 the same have not, in fact, been so delivered and de-
11 posited, shall be punished by imprisonment not less
12 than one year nor more than ten.
