## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT to provide for the recording of certain contracts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No stipulation in a note for more than
- 2 thirty dollars that the goods and chattels for which the
- 3 note is given shall remain the property of the payee
- 4 until payment, shall be valid against any other person
- 5 than the parties thereto, unless possession of such
- 6 property is retained by the payee or the note is
- 7 recorded in the same place and manner as mortgages
- 8 of personal property.
  - SECT. 2. The recording officer shall receive for such
- 2 record twenty-five cents, and on receipt of his fee
- 3 shall record all such notes delivered to him in a book
- 4 kept for that purpose.
