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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

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AN ACT to provide for the recording of certain contracts.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. No stipulation in a note for more than  
2 thirty dollars that the goods and chattels for which the  
3 note is given shall remain the property of the payee  
4 until payment, shall be valid against any other person  
5 than the parties thereto, unless possession of such  
6 property is retained by the payee or the note is  
7 recorded in the same place and manner as mortgages  
8 of personal property.

SECT. 2. The recording officer shall receive for such  
2 record twenty-five cents, and on receipt of his fee  
3 shall record all such notes delivered to him in a book  
4 kept for that purpose.
