STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relating to the claims of Maine against the United States for interest on advances made by Massachusetts in the war of eighteen hundred and twelve—fifteen.

Resolved, That the justice of the claim of Massachu-

- 2 setts and Maine to the payment of interest upon their
- 3 advances to the United States during the war of
- 4 eighteen hundred twelve and fifteen, with Great
- 5 Britain, cannot be questioned, after the payment of
- 6 interest to every other state which made such advances
- 7 during that struggle; and now that peace and pros-
- 8 perity are restored to the country, Maine confidently
- 9 expects that this claim will be recognized and pro-
- 10 vided for.

Resolved, That the appropriation by Massachusetts

2 and Maine of the proceeds of this claim to the con-

- 3 struction of a work of the first national importance—
 4 the connection of the railroad system of the United
 5 States with that of the adjoining maratime provinces
 6 of Great Britain, and upon the payment of which
 7 depends its completion, cannot fail to be appreciated
 8 by their sister states; and especially the patriotism
 9 and public spirit of Massachusetts in setting apart
- 11 deserves grateful acknowledgment from the country.

 Resolved, That the extension of American railroads to
 2 the eastern and northern frontiers of Maine, although
 3 important to the defense of this state are still more
 4 important to the United States, by the command which
 5 they will give over the military lines of communication
 6 between Halifax and the valley of the St. Lawrence.

10 her means to a work for removed from her borders,

Resolved, That when the money and lands of the 2 republic have been profusely appropriated for the con3 struction of railroads west of the Alleghanies, while 4 nothing has been so appropriated east of them, it is 5 with regret and concern that this state has witnessed 6 the delays in responding to her claims, not for a 7 gratuity but for the payment of a debt of undeniable 8 justice, devoted by her to a work of national impor9 tance, and the liquidation of which is asked for only 10 upon the same principles which have governed in the 11 settlements of the United States with all the states, for

- 12 military advances during the Revolutionary war, the
- 13 war of eighteen hundred and twelve-fifteen, and the
- 14 war with Mexico.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to commu-

- 2 nicate a copy of these resolves to our senators and
- 3 representatives in congress.
