## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY.

AN ACT relative to reversal of final judgments in criminal cases on account of error in the sentence.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whenever a final judgment in any criminal case shall

- 2 be reversed by the supreme judicial court, upon a writ
- 3 of error, on account of error in the sentence, the court
- 4 may render such judgment therein as should have been
- 5 rendered, or may remand the case for that purpose to
- 6 the court before whom the conviction was had.
