## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT authorizing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who has served by enlist-2 ment in the army or navy of the United States, in the 3 war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, on the quota 4 of Maine, and who has been disabled by wounds, or 5 other injury received in said service in the line of 6 duty, shall be entitled to a pension from the State of 7 Maine, not exceeding eight dollars per month; pro-8 vided, that such soldier or seaman is unable from his 9 own resources and the United States pension to obtain 10 a livelihood.

SECT. 2. The widow during her widowhood, orphan 2 children under twelve years of age, or the dependent

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3 mother or sister of any soldier or seaman, deceased 4 from wounds, disease or injury sustained in the service 5 while in the line of duty, are entitled to the same pen-6 sion as is provided in section one, and under similar 7 conditions; *provided*, that no more than eight dollars 8 per month be paid to one family.

SECT. 3. Sections one and two of this act shall not 2 be construed so as to include any soldier or seaman 3 who was not a resident of this State at the time of 4 entering the service, or who has not since become a 5 resident thereof.

SECT. 4. The execution of this act shall devolve 2 upon the governor and council, who shall regulate the 3 proof required to entitle applicants to the benefit of 4 this act, and issue certificates therefor.

SECT. 5. Upon the issue of said certificate, the 2 treasurer of the city, town, or plantation where the 3 pensioner resides, shall be notified thereof, and the 4 said treasurer shall pay quarterly, from the treasury 5 of said city, town or plantation, to the pensioner, the 6 amount specified and for the time specified in said cer-7 tificate, take voucher therefor, and the same shall be 8 reimbursed to the said treasurer from the treasury of 9 the state.

SECT. 6. The necessary blanks shall be issued to the 2 mayors of cities, selectmen of towns, and assessors of

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3 plantations, as the governor may direct, and the ex4 penses incurred in printing and distribution shall be
5 paid out of the treasury of the state.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect from and after 2 the thirty-first day of December, eighteen hundred and 3 seventy, and continue in force one year.
