## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT concerning the liability of railroads for defective crossings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. In any action against the inhabitants of

- 2 a town for damages alleged to have occurred by reason
- 3 of a defect in a railroad crossing constituting a part of
- 4 a highway which said town is obliged to keep in re-
- 5 pair, the railroad company owning or occupying such
- 6 crossing may be notified of the pendency of the suit,
- 7 and may take upon itself the defence of the same.

SECT. 2. In the trial of such action, after notice as

- 2 provided in the first section has been given, if the
- 3 plaintiff recovers damages and the jury find specially

- 4 that the same was occasioned by the fault of said rail-
- 5 road company, the company shall be liable to the
- 6 defendants in said suit in an action of debt for all
- 7 damages and costs paid by them.
  - Sect. 3. The notice required in section one of this
- 2 act shall be by copy of the writ served upon the com-
- 3 pany at least thirty days before the sitting of the court
- 4 to which it is returnable, or by such notice as the
- 5 court may order after the entry of said action.
