## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT additional to chapter forty of the revised statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, relating to river fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The limit of depth prescribed for weirs 2 in section thirty-four of chapter forty of the revised 3 statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-one, shall be 4 measured in the entrance of the weir. Weirs may 5 exceed the limit of two feet depth, measured as afore-6 said, under the following conditions, namely : *First*, 7 The distance from ordinary low-water mark to the en-8 trance of such weir shall not exceed one hundred feet. 9 *Second*, No such weir shall obstruct more than one-10 eighth part of the width of the channel. *Third*,

11 Every such weir shall be stripped, so as to render it12 incapable of taking fish on and after the fifteenth day13 of June, annually; these conditions to apply only to14 weirs that exceed the aforesaid limit of depth.

SECT. 2. Section thirty-three of chapter forty of 2 the revised statutes of eighteen hundred and seventy-3 one shall not apply to the Kennebec, Androscoggin or 4 Penobscot rivers or their tributaries.
