STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine.

Resolved, That for the fifty-first legislature and the
2 succeeding legislatures to and including that of the
3 year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the
4 county of Androscoggin shall choose nine representa-
5 tives, to be apportioned as follows, to wit :

6 Lewiston, three ; Auburn, two ; Durham, Lisbon
7 and Webster, one ; Minot and Poland, one ; Turner
8 and Livermore, one ; East Livermore, Green, Leeds
9 and Wales, one.

The county of Aroostook shall choose seven represen-
2 tatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Amity, Hodgdon, Linneus, Orient, Weston, and the
4 plantations of Bancroft, Greenwood, Haynesville,
5 number eleven, range one, Oakfield, Glenwood, and

6 all that portion of Aroostook county lying south of the
7 north line of Oakfield, Linneus and Hodgdon, and
8 east of the west line of the third range, one ; Houlton,
9 Littleton, Monticello, Ludlow, New Limerick, and the
10 townships B and C in the second range, one ; Bridge-
11 water, Mars Hill, Easton, Presque Isle, Maysville and
12 the plantations of Alva, Castle Hill, Mapleton, West-
13 field, and the townships D and E in the second range,
14 and numbers nine, ten and eleven in the third range,
15 one ; Fort Fairfield, Limestone, Lyndon, Wash-
16 burn, and the plantations of Perham, Woodland, and
17 township number fifteen in the third range, one ;
18 Madawaska, Grant Isle, the plantations of Hamlin,
19 Van Buren, Cyr, and all that portion of Aroostook
20 county lying east of the west line of range three, and
21 north of the north line of Limestone, Lyndon, and
22 number fifteen in the third range, one ; Sherman,
23 Smyrna, Masardis, Dalton, and the plantations of
24 Crystal, Island Falls, Portage Lake, and all other plan-
25 tations and townships in Aroostook county lying south
26 of the north line of Portage lake plantation, and west
27 of the west line of the third range except Castle Hill
28 plantation, one ; Frenchville and Fort Kent, and all
29 the remaining portion of Aroostook county not included
30 in any other district, one.

The county of Cumberland shall choose twenty representatives, to be apportioned as follows :

1 Portland, five; Cape Elizabeth, one; Westbrook, one;

3 Deering, one; Brunswick, one; Gorham, one; Bridgton,

5 one; Windham, one; Pownal and Freeport, one; Har-

7 rison, Otisfield and Casco, one; Baldwin and Standish,

9 one; Gray and New Gloucester, one; Falmouth and

11 Cumberland, one; Scarborough and Harpswell, one;

13 Raymond, Naples and Sebago, one; Yarmouth and

15 North Yarmouth, one.

The county of Franklin shall choose five representa-

3 tives, to be apportioned as follows :

4 Farmington, Perkins plantation and Washington

6 plantation, one; Chesterville, New Sharon, Industry

8 and Temple, one; Wilton, Jay and Carthage, one;

10 Phillips, Weld, Avon and Strong, one; New Vine-

12 yard, Freeman, Kingfield, Salem, Madrid, Rangely,

14 Rangely plantation, Number Six plantation, Greenvale

16 plantation, Letter E plantation, Eustis plantation,

18 Long plantation, Dallas plantation, Copelin plantation,

20 and all other territory not included in any other dis-

22 trict, one.

The county of Hancock shall choose nine representa-
2
3 tives, to be apportioned as follows :

4 Ellsworth, one; Bucksport and Verona, one; Orland,
5
6 Castine and Brooksville, one; Penobscot, Sedgwick,

5 Brooklin and Long Island, one; Bluehill, Surry and
 6 Dedham, one; Mt. Desert, Eden, Tremont and Cran-
 7 berry Isle, one; Deer Isle, Swan Isle, and all other
 8 islands in said county not included in any other dis-
 9 trict, one; Gouldsbrough, Sullivan, Franklin, East-
 10 brook and townships and plantations number seven,
 11 eight, nine, ten and twenty-one, one; Trenton, Lamoine,
 12 Hancock, Waltham, Mariaville, Otis, Amherst, Au-
 13 rora, plantation number thirty-three, and all other
 14 plantations and townships not included in any other
 15 district, one.

The county of Kennebec shall choose thirteen repre-
 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Readfield, Mt. Vernon and Vienna, one; Winthrop,
 4 Wayne and Fayette, one; Hallowell and Chelsea, one;
 5 Manchester, Litchfield and Monmouth, one; Gardiner,
 6 one; Pittston, West Gardiner and Farmingdale, one;
 7 Augusta, two; China, Albion, Clinton Gore and Unity
 8 plantation, one; Vassalborough and Windsor, one;
 9 Benton, Clinton and Winslow, one; Sidney, Belgrade
 10 and Rome, one; Waterville, one.

The county of Knox shall choose eight representa-
 2 tives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Camden, one; North Haven, Vinalhaven and South
 4 Thomaston, one; St. George, Cushing and Friendship,

5 one; Thomaston, Matinicus, Muscle Ridge, Otter and
6 Cranberry islands, one; Appleton, Washington and
7 Hope, one; Union and Warren, one; Rockland, two.

The county of Lincoln shall choose six representa-
2 tives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Wiscasset, Dresden and Edgecomb, one; Boothbay,
4 Westport and Southport, one; Newcastle, Noblebor-
5 ough, Alna and Somerville, one; Damariscotta, Bristol,
6 and Monhegan, one; Whitefield, Jefferson and Bre-
7 men, one; Waldoborough, Muscongus, Musk and Cow
8 islands, one.

The county of Oxford shall choose eight representa-
2 tives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Paris, Greenwood, Hamlin Grant and Milton planta-
4 tion, one; Norway, Waterford, Albany, Stoneham and
5 Mason, one; Buckfield, Hebron and Oxford, one;
6 Hiram, Denmark, Lovel and Sweden, one; Porter,
7 Brownfield, Fryeburg and Stowe, one; Canton, Hart-
8 ford, Peru, Sumner, and Franklin plantation, one;
9 Rumford, Dixfield, Mexico, Woodstock, Hanover,
10 Byron and Roxbury, one; Bethel, Gilead, Grafton,
11 Newry, Andover, Andover North and West Surplus,
12 Upton, Lincoln plantation, number five range one,
13 Riley plantation, Fryeburg Academy Grant, and Let-
14 ter C, one.

The county of Penobscot shall choose eighteen representatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Bangor, three ; Hampden and Veazie, one ; Old-
 4 town, one ; Orono and Glenburn, one ; Brewer and
 5 Orrington, one ; Dexter and Corinna, one ; Exeter
 6 and Garland, one ; Newburg, Dixmont and Etna, one ;
 7 Hermon, Carmel and Levant, one ; Newport, Stetson
 8 and Plymouth, one ; Charleston, Bradford and La-
 9 grange, one ; Corinth, Hudson, Kenduskeag and
 10 Alton, one ; Holden, Clifton, Eddington, Bradley,
 11 Milford and Greenbush, one ; Springfield, Lee, Carrol,
 12 Prentiss, Winn, Mattawamkeag, Independence planta-
 13 tion, Webster plantation, Lakeville plantation, number
 14 three range one, number five range one, and number
 15 seven range four, one ; Passadumkeag, Lowell, Bur-
 16 lington, Enfield, Mattamiscontis, Howland, Edinburg,
 17 Maxfield, Argyle, Greenfield, number one south of
 18 Lowell, number two south of Burlington, number
 19 three range three, and number two range three north
 20 of Maxfield and Mattamiscontis, one ; Lincoln, Patten,
 21 Mt. Chase, Chester, and all remaining territory in
 22 Penobscot county not included in any other district,
 23 one.

The county of Piscataquis shall choose three representatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Dover, Sangerville and Parkman, one ; Atkinson,

4 Milo, Orneville, Medford, Brownville, Sebec, Williams-
5 burg, Barnard, Bowerbank plantation, Katahdin Iron
6 Works plantation, and all townships and plantations
7 north of these, one; Foxcroft, Guilford, Abbott, Mon-
8 son, Blanchard, Kingsbury, Wellington, Shirly, Green-
9 ville, Howard plantation, Elliotsville plantation, and
10 all other territory not included in any other district,
11 one.

The county of Sagadahoc shall choose four represen-
2 tatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Bath, one; Arrowsic, Georgetown, Phippsburg and
4 Woolwich, one; West Bath, Topsham and Bowdoin-
5 ham, one ; Richmond, Bowdoin and Perkins, one.

The county of Somerset shall choose eight represen-
2 tatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Fairfield, Smithfield and Mercer, one; Anson, Nor-
4 ridgewock and Starks, one; New Portland, Madison
5 and Solon, one; Skowhegan and Detroit, one; Pal-
6 myra, Pittsfield and Canaan, one; Hartland, St.
7 Albans, Ripley and Cambridge, one; Harmony,
8 Athens, Cornville and Embden, one; Moscow, Con-
9 cord, Bingham, Mayfield, Lexington, Brighton, Dead
10 river, Flagstaff, Moose river, West Forks, The Forks,
11 and all the plantations in Somerset county, one.

The county of Waldo shall choose eight representa-
2 tives, to be apportioned as follows:

3 Belfast, one; Searsport and Stockton, one; Winter-
 4 port and Frankfort, one; Islesborough, Northport and
 5 Lincolnville, one; Prospect, Monroe, Jackson and
 6 Troy, one; Brooks, Waldo, Morrill, Belmont, Knox
 7 and Swanville, one; Burnham, Unity, Thorndike and
 8 Palermo, one; Montville, Searsmont, Liberty and
 9 Freedom, one.

The county of Washington shall choose ten repre-
 2 sentatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Cherryfield, Steuben, Millbridge, Beddington, Deblois
 4 and Devereaux, one; Columbia, Columbia Falls, Ma-
 5 chias, Northfield, number eighteen, middle division,
 6 East Machias, Marshfield, Whitneyville, Wesley, Craw-
 7 ford, Alexander, number eighteen and number nine-
 8 teen, east division, one; Machiasport, Cutler, Whiting,
 9 Trescott, Marion, Cooper, number fourteen, east
 10 division, one; Harrington, Addison, Jonesport, Jones-
 11 borough and Centreville, one; Lubec, Edmunds, Den-
 12 nysville, Charlotte and Meddybemps, one; Pembroke;
 13 Perry and Robbinston, one; Eastport, one; Calais, one;
 14 Baring, Danforth, Princeton, Baileyville, Topsfield,
 15 number twenty-one, north division, plantation, Cody-
 16 ville, Jackson Brook, Tallmadge, Waite, number seven
 17 range two, number nine range four, and all other
 18 plantations not included in any other district, one.

The county of York shall choose fifteen representatives, to be apportioned as follows :

3 Acton, Newfield and Shapleigh, one ; Berwick and
4 North Berwick, one; Biddeford, two; Buxton and
5 Hollis, one; Cornish and Parsonsfield, one; Dayton
6 and Kennebunkport, one; Eliot and South Berwick,
7 one; Lyman and Limington, one; Kennebunk and
8 Alfred, one; Kittery, one; Waterborough and Lim-
9 erick, one; Saco, one; Sanford and Lebanon, one;
10 Wells, for the years eighteen hundred and seventy-
11 two, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, eighteen
12 hundred and seventy-six, eighteen hundred and seventy-
13 eight and eighteen hundred and eighty, one; York,
14 for the years eighteen hundred and seventy-three,
15 eighteen hundred and seventy-five, eighteen hundred
16 and seventy-seven, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine
17 and eighteen hundred and eighty-one, one.
