STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-ONE.

AN ACT additional to section twenty-five of chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, in relation to petitions for increase of damages by reason of the laying out, altering or widening of town ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. When a petition for increase of damages, provided by section twenty-five of chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, is presented to the county commissioners, they shall, at their first regular term thereafter, order a notice to the town interested in such petition, to appear at the next regular term, and the case shall stand continued, and no jury shall be summoned until all parties in interest have been notified and had an opportunity to be present and

10 enter into an agreement for a committee as provided
11 by section eight of the same chapter.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
